Wind and Wave Scarf

This simple scarf is knit in plain garter stitch, the wavy pattern being created by the use of stitches of varying length. Patons *Pompero* and *Tivoli Zest* are used in this particular instance but any Aran weight yarn combined with any novelty yarn will work just as well.

Materials:

2-3 x 50gms balls of Aran weight yarn
1 x 50gms balls of novelty (eg eyelash) yarn
1 pair of 7mm needles

Cast on 25 stitches using novelty yarn
Knit 6ins in garter stitch (every row knit)
Change to main yarn
Knit 1 row

Pattern (10 rows)

Row 1: (K2, k2 wrapping yarn around needle twice, k1 wrapping yarn around needle 3 times, k2 wrapping yarn around needle twice, k1) 3 times, k1.

Row 2: knit dropping extra wraps from needle

Row 3: k3 wrapping yarn around needle 2 times, (k3, k2 wrapping yarn around needle twice, k1 wrapping yarn around needle 3 times, k2 wrapping yarn around needle 2 times) 2 times, k3, k2 wrapping yarn around needle 2 times, k1 wrapping yarn around needle 3 times

Row 4: knit dropping extra wraps from needle

Repeat rows 1- 4, 10 times

Band (6 rows)

Knit 1 row
Change to novelty yarn and knit 4 rows
Change back to Aran weight yarn and knit 1 row

Repeat 40 rows of pattern in Aran weight followed by the 6 row band until scarf is desired length finishing with a 6ins band using novelty yarn.

Alternatives

- 1 Stagger the novelty yarn bands, varying the number of rows and their placement.
- 2 Use the same number of wraps across the rows to give you a consistently long stitch.
